Summary

The DIVINEF project aims to promote the integration of people with disabilities, young people in difficulty (NEETs), migrants and refugees in non-formal education activities. To achieve this objective, a MOOC (online course) dedicated to inclusion will be created for professionals and volunteers in the animation and education sector.

This training will provide essential content to help them think and act concretely in favour of inclusion, offering them practical tools adapted to their missions.

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


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Implementation of the DIVINEF project

Since the project was launched in February 2024, the French and Cypriot partners have intensified their efforts to ensure the success of this initiative. Several working meetings, both online and face-to-face, have helped to consolidate the project's foundations and plan its implementation.

These meetings led to the development of a project management plan, a communications plan and a programme of activities to be carried out locally with young people. These activities include a field survey, video interviews with professionals and young people on the theme of inclusion, and the creation of communication tools such as a newsletter and a dedicated website. These actions aim to promote inclusion and raise awareness of diversity among professionals in a non-formal education setting.



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USSAP Boxe: A pioneering club in sport and social inclusion

Based in a priority neighbourhood, this club uses sport as a tool for social inclusion and crime prevention. Since 1995, the club has been working with all sections of the public, including people with disabilities, and has developed strong local partnerships focusing on social inclusion, prevention, education and citizenship. Its initiatives are deployed in prisons, social centres and within clubs in France and abroad to promote an inclusive sports policy.

The club, which has won several awards for its commitment to the inclusion of young people in difficulty, also helps young people from disadvantaged areas to find work through the government's PIC 100% inclusion programme. The emphasis is on developing a sports policy that is accessible to people with disabilities, in particular through educational and amateur boxing, with specific training to encourage their integration.

The club also runs a wide range of sporting activities for children, teenagers and adults, including holidays at the seaside and in the mountains, as well as amateur, educational and Olympic boxing programmes. The club also offers socio-educational integration initiatives for young people, as well as handiboxing and archery programmes for people with disabilities. In 2022-2023, the club has registered d

Aux couleurs du DEBA is an organisation specialising in socio-educational support for young adults with disabilities and NEETs. With 15 years' experience in non-formal education and pedagogical engineering, it stands out for its expertise in European projects, particularly Erasmus+, and for the creation of innovative pedagogical tools.

The association runs a number of projects focusing on the prevention of violence, the fight against discrimination, gender equality and social inclusion. It is also involved in the creation of online training courses and skills repositories for education and entertainment professionals, as well as European projects focusing on sport and inclusion. One of its flagship projects, 'Inclusion, a step towards youth employment', aims to integrate young people in difficulty into the world of work through innovative approaches.

Aux couleurs du DEBA focuses mainly on young adults and education professionals, helping them to develop their skills and find employment. It is recognised for its ability to train marginalised groups in the entertainment sector.

Its initiatives include the 'ENTER' project, dedicated to the employability of NEETs, and 'GAMESS', a serious-game for developing the social skills of autistic pupils.

Active in citizenship education and the inclusion of young people, STANDO provides its expertise to give everyone access to training and integration opportunities.
